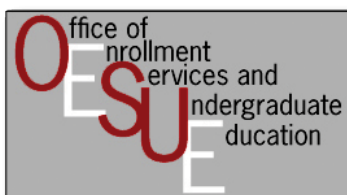
DATA ASSISTANCE FROM ESUE STAFF
